Local Language

Disruption of normal college operations, solicitation and distribution of unauthorized materials on the NWFSC campus, and any behaviors or actions judged by the Board of Trustees or its duly designated authorities to be inroads upon the integrity and common good of Northwest Florida State college are prohibited.

By virtue of its responsibility for the common good of Northwest Florida State College and the legal responsibility which it holds for the College, its activities, its programs, and its personnel, the Board of Trustees of Northwest Florida State College recognizes and accepts its ultimate responsibility for representing and protecting the College and its interests. On this basis, the Board elects to exercise its prerogative of choice and judgment with respect to the suitability and permissibility of any behaviors, of any activities, of any kind within the boundaries of the College campus, whether by employees of the college, by NWFSC students, or by persons not affiliated with NWFSC.

The responsibility for fulfilling the intent of this policy and the authority on behalf of the Board to make decisions as to such suitability and permissibility and to take action to alleviate violations of this policy is delegated to the President of the College and those members of his staff to whom he may delegate responsibility for observance of this policy.

The position of the Board of Trustees with respect to enforcement of this policy is that rational and prompt resolution of any disruptive behavior, disruptive activities, or any other inroads upon the integrity and common good of NWFSC should be pursued with all diligence, with full respect for the inalienable rights of each and every member of the College community, regardless of race, creed, color, sex, age, handicap, marital status, religion, or national origin.
