NWF RAIDER ATHLETIC PROGRAM ANNOUNCES BASEBALL & SOFTBALL

INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY CAMPAIGN

Investment in new training facilities is a necessity for premier athletic programs, not only to keep players in top performance condition but also to attract top recruits. On November 28, 2017, Dr. Devin Stephenson and Head Baseball and Softball Coaches, Doug Martin and Jack Byerley unveiled plans for a 10,000 square foot, state-of-the-art indoor practice facility. The total cost of the project is \$467,571. To date, \$288,250 has been raised in gifts and pledges, with \$179,321 remaining. "I am very excited about the launching of this project and certainly look forward to seeing it through to its completion," said Director of Athletics, Ramsey Ross. "Once completed, this facility will help us to not only build upon the strong record of success that NWF has always enjoyed in its baseball and softball programs, but it will also improve the quality of the experience for NWF student-athletes." The facility will be available to local high schools and the community when not in use by NWF students and coaches. ATHLETICS Raider Basketball Starts Strong!

Both Raider Basketball teams are headed into the holiday break undefeated! As of mid-December, the #5 women were 12-0 and they were nationally ranked in the top 10 in several categories: Shooting percentage (52.6%), 3 point percentage (42.4%), Free throw percentage (75.3%), Rebounds per game (47.6), Assists per game (21.6), and Steals per game (17.3). They were led in scoring by Trinity Baptiste (14.9), Georgia Gayle (13.5 points/game), and Jade Lewis (12.7). The #1 men were 14-0 on the season so far and they defeated #9 Motlow State (81-64), #16 San Jacinto (95-69), and #21 Spartanburg Methodist (94-60). Five Raiders were averaging scoring in double figures: Andres Feliz (18.7), Tray Boyd (15.7), Chris Duarte (11.7), DJ Funderburk (11.2), and Kelvin Robinson (10.8). Both teams first conference game will be Saturday, January 6th at Pensacola State College. The women will tip-off at 5:30 p.m. and the men will follow at 7:30 p.m. Their first home conference game will be Wednesday, January 10th against Gulf Coast State. We look forward to your support!

CBA PLANTS 10,000 PLANTS THROUGHOUT OKALOOSA & WALTON COUNTIES

The Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance's Grasses in Classes is a hands-on, environmental education program that gives students a direct role in the restoration of Choctawhatchee Bay. This fall, CBA educators and our AmeriCorps team partners planted 10,000 smooth cordgrass plants at more than 20 schools across Okaloosa and Walton Counties. Throughout the winter and into spring, students will tend to the grass nurseries at their schools while learning about local estuarine topics. In May, all classes will experience restoration first-hand when they plant their grasses into living shorelines across the Choctawhatchee Bay. ■
