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NON-CREDIT CLASSES

Adult Basic Education (ABE) classes offer students with academic skills below 9th grade level the opportunity to improve their skills in reading, writing, math, and English. After successfully completing an Adult Basic Education course, a student may enter the GED preparation course.

General Education (GED) preparation course offer students with academic skills at the 9th grade level or above the opportunity to prepare for the GED Examination to obtain the State of Florida High School Diploma.

English as a Second Language (ESL) classes offer students who have a primary language other than English the opportunity to acquire or improve oral and written English communication skills. Students who complete all levels of ESL course competencies may enter the GED Preparation course and/or college credit classes. This class is open enrollment and students may start at any time within the semester. COMPUTERS I - Learn Windows operating systems, exploration of the internet, file management and using email. Get exposed to Microsoft Word and eBay Buying & Selling. You will develop skills creating a basic letter, downloading and installing a program, using Windows System Restore, computer security, burning a data CD and storing information. EXCEL I - In this 6-hour workshop you will use Microsoft Excel to be able to crunch numbers quickly and easily using basic formulas and functions. Students will create a personal budget using Excel's financial features. Students will be able to make their data visually impacting, edit, and move and print data, as well as create charts. The computer labs use Windows 7. Completion of Computer 1 would be helpful but is not required. EXCEL II - This is a follow-up course to Excel I. In this 6-hour workshop you will use Microsoft Excel to learn how to streamline repetitive tasks and display spreadsheet data in more visually effective ways. It will focus on advanced functions, working within multiple worksheets and using Excel's database features to sort and filter a collection of information. To ensure your success, we recommend taking the Excel I course. COOKING AT THE CULINARY GALLERY - In this four week, progressive program, Chef Scott Nelson of The Culinary Gallery, will take students thru the basics of the culinary field, from basic food knowledge and terminology, knife skills and all basic food preparations, cooking techniques, and presentations. Each class will build on the skills learned in the previous class, culminating in a multi course meal as a "final exam". Registration fee includes meals and beverages. INTRODUCTION TO WINES OF THE WORLD - This class is a general introduction to the grape as it travels from the sun in different parts of the world to your taste buds at sunsets. Classes must be attended with 5 wine cork awards accumulated during the six sessions. You must participate, not just sit and age like good red wine! BEGINNING DOG OBEDIENCE - This is a 6 week course designed to help build a positive relationship between an owner and his dog by teaching the canine basic cues using positive reinforcement techniques. The cues covered will be Sit, Stay, Down, Loose leash walking and Come. Dogs must be 9 months or older and have proof of all shots. No aggressive dogs will be allowed to remain in the class. It is the responsibility of the human student to provide a proper dog collar or harness, a 6-foot leash (no retractable leashes allowed), dog treats and poop bags. There is a maximum of 8 students.
