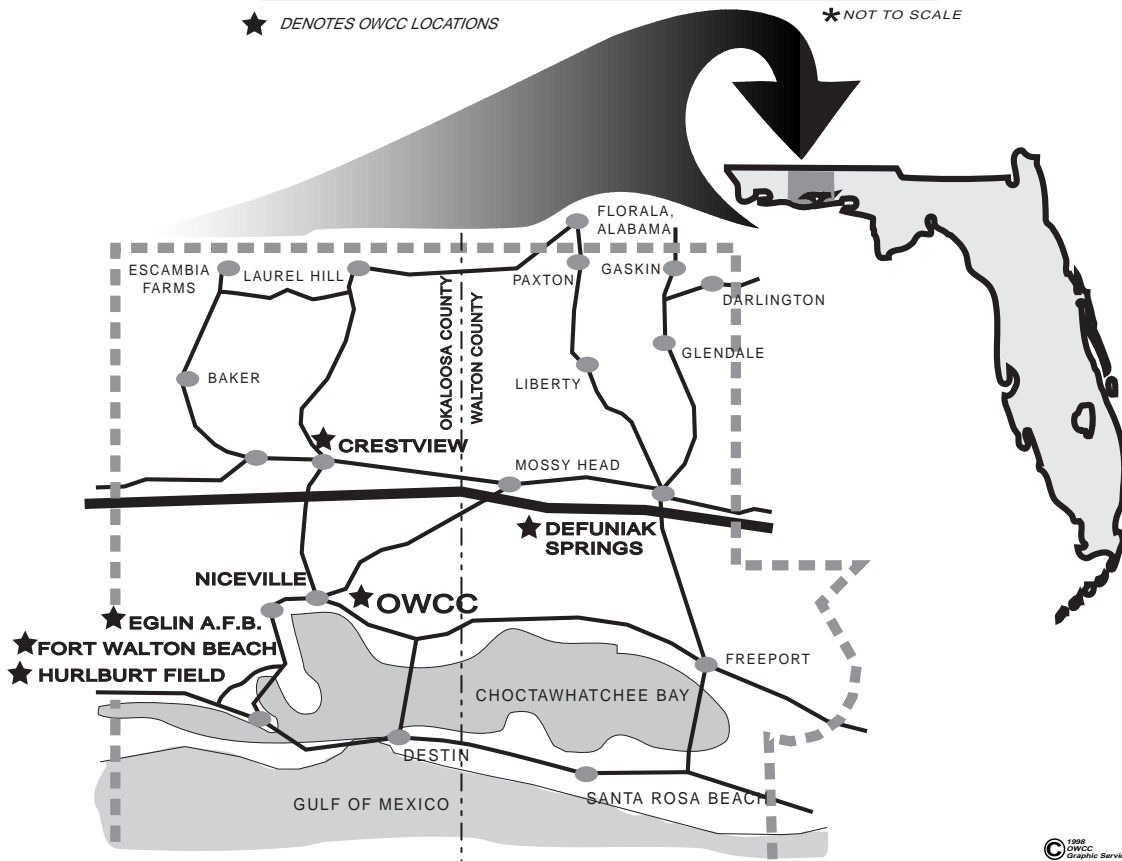

The Arts Center at the Okaloosa-Walton Community College Niceville campus is the cultural and artistic center for all of Northwest Florida. The 120,000 square foot fine and performing arts complex provides facilities unparalleled in the entire region for both students and the public. The \$20 million facility features a 1,650 seat main theater which hosts an annual series of Broadway shows, a 195-seat Sprint Theater which provides flexible space for smaller productions, a 2,000 square foot dance studio and an art wing with two galleries, which house the college's multi-million dollar permanent art collection as well as traveling exhibits. The center's music wing features separate rehearsal halls for the college's symphony orchestra, jazz band and symphonic band, a 24 track recording studio, a recital hall, a fully computerized music theory and composition classroom with 24 workstations, and solo, ensemble and chorus rehearsal halls. The Arts Center's state-of-the-art features offer the finest in instructional facilities for students of the visual, musical and theatrical arts and the Humanities.
