- PAYMENT OF FEES:** All fees must be paid by the "Pay By" date listed on the student's printed schedule of classes or on the RaiderNet schedule of classes. Payment due dates are also listed in the printed class schedule for the term. Failure to pay by the payment deadline will result in the student being dropped from their classes.
- DROP/ADD:** Students may drop or add a class until the established deadline for the term as listed in the schedule of classes and college catalog. Courses dropped during the drop/add period will not appear on the student's permanent record.
- AUDIT:** A student registering in a college-credit course on a "not-for-credit" basis will be enrolled in an audit status. Upon completion of the course, an "X" grade will be awarded with no impact on the student's GPA. A student wishing to audit an occupational course must obtain permission in advance from the appropriate department head or division director. College prep courses may be audited only with advance approval of the Vice President of Academic Affairs. Classes changed to Audit after the Drop/Add period will count as an attempt.
- PROSPECTIVE GRADUATES:** Students must apply for graduation during the semester they plan to graduate. Students may apply to graduate on the RaiderNet before the established deadline for the term. All potential Associate of Arts and Baccalaureate graduates must meet CLAS (College Level Academic Skills) exemption requirements.

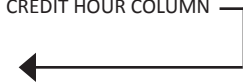

DRUG-FREE SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Northwest Florida State College strongly supports the concept of a drug-free school and community. The College has stated very clearly in the statement of Student Rights and Responsibilities, published in the College Catalog, the sanctions it will impose for any student who uses, manufactures, distributes, sells, or possesses alcoholic beverages or illicit drugs at any College location and/or at any college-sponsored event or activity. You can obtain your copy of the catalog at any college location or from the Office of Student Services on the Niceville Campus. In addition, students should be aware that the College will refer for prosecution any student in violation of any local ordinances or state and federal laws applicable to the cities and counties where the College is located.

Students should be aware that the penalties involved are twofold. First, legal sanctions can be heavy. The following is for informational purposes because laws may change. For the first time conviction for the use of drugs you can be fined and/or go to jail. For second offenses in certain quantities, you can spend 30 years in prison and be fined up to \$500,000 upon conviction of the distribution, sale and/or possession of controlled substances (F.S. 775.082, and F.S. 499.06). It is unlawful to have alcohol in your possession if you are under the legal drinking age (21). It is also unlawful to sell, give or serve alcoholic beverages to anyone under 21. It's a FELONY to use a false ID to procure alcoholic beverages. These penalties could apply to any student who uses, manufactures, distributes, sells, or possesses alcoholic beverages or illicit drugs on campus or at the centers or at any college-sponsored event or activity. Second, the health risks associated with the use of controlled substances and alcohol are possible convulsions, coma, memory loss, major organ damage (heart, lungs, brain), changes in heart and respiratory rates, loss of coordination, and even death. The mental impairments can include loss of concentration, violent behavior, hallucinations, paranoia, anxiety, sleeplessness, insomnia, depression and damage to short-term memory.

Contact the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Education counselor in Student Services on the Niceville Campus or the counselor on the Fort Walton Beach Campus if you need information or counseling regarding treatment of drug and/or alcohol use or addiction. The counselors maintain a list of local treatment centers that will help you get DRUG-FREE. We ask that you support the College in its fight for a drug-free school and community.
