Course Description

This course is designed to provide the RN to BSN student with an introduction to the research process and evidence based practice. The purpose of the course is to stimulate interest in nursing research; to enable students to understand and judge the usefulness of scientific findings; and to develop an understanding of how clinical proficiency is combined with experimental proof to produce nursing practices based upon evidence. An on-line teaching method is used with optional workshops available to students.

Logging into Class - Class Attendance

All students are encouraged to login to their course at least every 48-72 hours. Doing so allows students to view important course material and make progress toward course completion.

Students who do not login for seven days and turn in one assignment late may be required to meet personally with the instructor or program director for written counseling to problem solve and help the student to master the course content. The written counseling form will be filed with a student’s program advisor. Should the same problem continue after the written counseling, students may earn a failing grade in the course.

Students who stop attending class or are not able to pass the course due to attendance expectations stated in the syllabus may receive a failing grade of “FA.” An “FA” grade is a failing grade in GPA calculations and may impact the receipt of federal aid in subsequent courses. Students traveling for college approved activities will not be penalized academically but will be responsible for missed work.

<p>Search and Sources (Table)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Examples to include: systematic reviews, meta-analyses, clinical guidelines, and research studies related to your PICO(T) or PEO question. • Summarize the search history in a table on one – four slides using the following headings: Database, Keywords, Limits, and Number of articles found on each search. See table example in course content. • Search should include literature reviews from four different and appropriate data bases. • Data bases pertinent to the problem area may include: CINAHL, MEDLINE, EBSCO, Gale, Cochrane, or others. • Select the three articles that you feel best advance the state of nursing knowledge related to your PICO or PEO question • Discuss how and why the three best articles were chosen either in the YouTube video or at the poster presentation. 	50
