This instructional design workshop will benefit both students and faculty with purposeful course design and best practices that anticipate students' common needs at the start of the semester. The session provides instructors with several ideas for connecting with students earlier and clearly so that they are better informed, engaged, and invested in the course from the first day of the term. Faculty will see benefits through saved time and energy spent on individual student communication, and students will have a more positive classroom experience because they feel comfortable and informed at the outset of the course. The workshop is intended for a range of audiences, including beginners and advanced users, and instructors will leave with many practical ideas to implement immediately, as well as a handout that provides additional instruction and even more ideas about how to improve online instruction from the ground up.
