STATE LICENSING REQUIREMENT: All entities defined under Chapters 607, 617 or 620, Florida Statutes, seeking to do business with the College shall be on file and in good standing with the State of Florida's Department of State.

Only communications from the proposer's representative that are in writing and signed will be recognized by the College as duly authorized expressions on behalf of the proposer.

INCLUSION OF SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

TERMINATION AT WILL

The contract resulting from this ITB may be terminated by either party upon no less than thirty (3) calendar days' notice, with or without cause.

SUBCONTRACTORS

The proposer is fully responsible for all work performed under this ITB. The proposer may, upon receiving prior written consent from the College's Purchasing Director, enter into written subcontract(s) for performance of certain of its functions under the Contract.
