

PRESIDENT'S PERSPECTIVE

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INNOVATION ACROSS NORTHWEST FLORIDA STATE COLLEGE

As we soar into the new academic year, we celebrate the innovative spirit of our faculty and staff both inside and outside the classroom.

I am incredibly proud to report NWFSC's completion rate increased from 40% in 2016-17 to 58% in 2017-18, as reported by Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System. This figure represents a combination of the graduation and transfer rate. Nationally, the 2-year completion rate average is 40%, making it evident our team is focused on helping students achieve progress toward their degree.

I commend the nursing faculty on their 100% pass rate for the National Counsel Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). This national exam is required before students can practice nursing in the United States or Canada. Further, I applaud Dr. Liz Robison, simulation coordinator and nursing professor, for her election to the International Association for Clinical Simulation and Learning's Board of Directors to serve as the Vice President of Finance. These distinctions demonstrate our faculty's commitment to excellence, and I know you join me in congratulating them.

Our College campus infrastructure is more than 50 years old and with waning state funding for renovations, our team researched options to address inefficient equipment and long overdue capital improvements. With support from the Board of Trustees, NWFSC entered into a contract with Johnson Controls, Inc. (JCI) to address the aging infrastructure. This agreement allowed the College to replace the

NWFSC NURSING PROGRAM EXCELS

Spring 2019 marked the largest graduating cohort ever for Northwest Florida State College's Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) degree, with 56 students graduating. If that was not enough good news for the ASN program at NWFSC, every student who attempted the National Counsel Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) this spring (55 of 56), passed the test and obtained their license.

"Our nursing program is a reflection of our College's goal, to be the best at what we do," said Dr. Devin Stephenson, president of Northwest Florida State College. "I am pleased to see our students and faculty members rising to the challenge and creating one of the most successful nursing programs in the country."

The NCLEX-RN is a nationwide examination for the licensing of nurses and must be passed before being licensed to practice nursing in the United States and Canada.

of student recruitment, financial aid, enrollment, retention and assessment, graduation and beyond.











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25-year old central HVAC as well as air handlers for which parts are no longer available; address lighting to reinforce our commitment to safety; update water fixtures to be more efficient; and replace the hot/cold water loop on the Niceville campus, which was more than 50-years old. In addition, all roofs at the Fort Walton Beach Campus were replaced. This project represents the largest performance based contract among Florida College System institutions and cut NWFSC's \$44 million dollar deferred maintenance backlog by more than 50%. The performance based energy contract ensures accrued savings are utilized to pay JCI over a 15-year period, resulting in much needed upgrades with no bearing on the College's bottom line. Our team was asked to present about the innovative nature of this project at the Southern Association of College and University Business Officers conference and has received multiple inquiries about the project from colleges and universities across the Southeast.

I am proud to announce that NWFSC is under contract with the Triumph Gulf Coast Board for the largest grant ever in the College's history for our Walton Works project. This \$5.8 million dollar project is supported with \$2.76 million from Triumph Gulf Coast, \$1.5 million from the Walton Board of County Commissioners, and the balance from NWFSC. The project will create 10 new workforce programs at the Chautauqua Center in DeFuniak Springs providing training in cybersecurity, unmanned vehicle systems operations, building trades, and public safety. We thank the Walton Board of County Commissioners and Walton County Sheriff's Office for their partnership to expand workforce and education initiatives.

Lastly, I am pleased to introduce Dr. Deborah Kish, our new Vice President for Teaching & Learning who you will learn more about in this issue of President's Perspective. We welcome Dr. Kish as she leads innovation and advancement in learning.

Kish began teaching at Valencia College in 2002 and has worked in various roles in higher education since that time. She most recently served as Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for the National Division at Rio Salado College in Arizona.

Kish grew up in a teaching as both of her household. parents were teachers and school administrators. Early in her career, Kish spent more than a decade in the corporate world as an attorney while teaching as an adjunct and associate professor. She transitioned into academic administration at Aims Community College in Greeley, Colorado, where she ultimately served as the Vice President of Academic Affairs. In this role, she oversaw more than 160 credit and non-credit programs as well as led strategic planning initiatives, institutional accreditation, grant development, program development, curriculum, online learning, and budget



development. Most recently, she led the national expansion of Rio Salado College to meet the educational needs of underserved students in educational deserts.

Kish holds a Bachelor of Science in Secondary Social Science and Education from Florida State University, a Master of Business Administration and Juris Doctor from the University of Florida, and a Doctor of Education in Community College Leadership from The Roueche Graduate Center of National American University.


