Nature of the Course

Although I sometimes give general guidelines of what the class will paint, there will be very few specific assignments. Likewise, there will be very few class lectures or demonstration of how to paint. My teaching style is application/critique: you paint, you ask (or I see), and I show and/or tell. This is the only effective teaching method when the class members have a wide variety of ability, expectation, interest, and when time is limited. I wander around the classroom and help you individually because in doing so, I am able to capture that teachable moment – the instant when you have a context for meaningful learning.

Supply List

You must have, and bring to class with you, appropriate supplies. Largely, “you get what you pay for” is not a bad axiom for art supplies. While I do not expect you to buy the most expensive supplies or to buy supplies in the largest quantities. I very strongly discourage you from buying the cheapest) such as “student” varieties – the quality and durability just is not there, or to purchase too few. Here is a list of supplies:

Canvas

1. 11” x 14” (preferred) or larger

Paint

9. Burnt Umber
10. Burnt Sienna
11. Yellow Ochre
12. Dioxidine Purple
