TEXTBOOK GUIDE FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENTS

Dual Enrollment Students do not pay for REQUIRED textbooks for classes at NWFSC. However, it is the student's responsibility after they have a confirmed schedule to go to the Barnes and Noble Bookstore on the Niceville Campus to receive books. Information regarding textbooks can be found in the Course Syllabus.

The following is information to help students understand the various book formats. Classes may have a physical book, a digital book that requires an access code, a book that is emailed, otherwise known as instant access book and finally, some classes only have a recommended book. Per the Articulation Agreements with the school districts and private schools, recommended books are not covered under Dual Enrollment.


In addition to the student using the syllabus to identify books for each class, students may also access their Raidernet Profile, view their current schedule and use the class information to search for books on the <u>Barnes and Noble website</u>. Click <u>Course Materials and Textbooks</u>, then <u>Find Course Material</u>. Enter Course information into each section of the form.

Students must go to the bookstore to pick up the book.




REQUIRED DIGITAL BOOK – EXAMPLE FOR HUM1020

Digital, otherwise known as INSTANT ACCESS IS EMAILED TO THE STUDENTS. The student must go to the bookstore and verify the email address and sign for the book to be emailed to the student.



REQUIRED BOOK – ACCESS CODE NEEDED - EXAMPLE FOR PSY2012

Students must go to the bookstore and pick up the Card containing their individual access code.
