



Associate in Science in Nursing Program and Student Outcomes

Program Outcomes:

Pass rates on the NCLEX-RN for Northwest Florida State College nursing graduates will be at least 80% for all first-time test-takers during the same 12-month period.

At least 80% of students admitted to the Associate Degree Nursing program will complete the program of study within 100%/150% of the program length (as measured by the time the student begins the first nursing course).
