Pool of Eligible Applicants

- Admitted to NWF State College
- Completed Radiography Online Application (Application period: July 28, 2023 through January 3, 2024
- All final paperwork must be received by January 3, 2024:
 - > College placement testing scores and all prep courses completed
 - > ALL transcripts (high school, other college/university)
- Cumulative college Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.50 or higher on a 4.00 scale* The GPA is cumulative. For students who have not earned graded non-developmental college hours at a regionally accredited institution, the high school GPA at the time of graduation, or GED scores will be considered.

Selection Point System

All eligible applicants accepted unless the number exceeds the available slots, in which case the weighted point system will be used to select students.

The applicants with the highest point totals are admitted first. If there is a tie among point totals prior to reaching program capacity, the applicant with the highest cumulative GPA will be selected. In the event of a tie amongst the alternates, the same process will be utilized. Please note that alternates with a bachelors degree or higher who are selected as alternates may move to the top of the alternate list.

*GPA and acceptance of transfer work is determined based on policies published in the current NWFSC Catalog and Student Handbook and as determined by the College Registrar. College prep, developmental, and upper division courses will not be included in determining GPA.
