#### Entrepreneurship, Leadership, & Mentorship

#### **Summary**

The college's new "Entrepreneurship, Leadership, & Mentorship" (ELM) youth initiative is a 9-month extracurricular program that runs from September-May for high school juniors and seniors who are interested in developing an entrepreneurial mindset, leadership skills, and developing as young professionals. Students who are invested in personal growth will learn about business, their local communities, and how their gifts and talents can be maximized in a future career. This program places a particular emphasis on trades and other skill-based, non-traditional professions to assist students in finding and cultivating the right path for their intended vocations. With a strong presence of and exposure to experts in their fields, students will have the opportunity to become mentees of community leaders while growing their network and learning with one another.

#### **Mission**

The mission of Northwest Florida State College's (NWFSC's) "Entrepreneurship, Leadership, & Mentorship" (ELM) youth program is to create opportunities for secondary education students to engage in and experience different vocational paths, develop an entrepreneurial mindset, advance leadership and service skills, cultivate a lifelong dedication to community involvement, and equip youth with the tools to create successful futures for themselves, their local areas, and beyond.

#### Goals for the Participant

- To encourage students to recognize their own potential and strive for personal growth and professional development.
- To activate the entrepreneurial mindset and build start-up skills to ensure their success and to support a more vibrant community
- To inspire students to cultivate leadership skills and an entrepreneurial mindset to carry throughout their lives.
- To provide an avenue for a diverse group of students to interact with one another, and with community leaders and decision makers.
- To expose students to the day-to-day expectations and responsibilities of various workforce specializations and career options.
- To give students hands-on experience in knowledge areas relevant to their career goals.
- To offer mentorship opportunities for students to learn from community leaders and skill experts.
- To acquaint students with local needs, resources, and other factors that influence the future development of Okaloosa and Walton counties.
- To foster students' interest in volunteer community involvement and practice service leadership.
- To equip students with the knowledge and tools to be active, effective members of society.
- To instill student pride in themselves, their communities, and their ability to give back to those communities.

#### **Application Criteria**

Applications are accepted through August 30, 2024. The class size ranges from 10-20 participants. ELM seeks participants who:

- Demonstrate leadership qualities in their school and community
- Commit necessary time and effort to complete the ELM program
- Hold high standards of personal integrity
- Desire to work with others in the community
- Must have and maintain 2.0 GPA

#### **Graduation Requirements**

Participants must attend a minimum of 6 training sessions and participate in and complete the class project to be eligible for program completion. Make-up options are available.
