

# **ELM Youth Program Student Application**

# Entrepreneurship, Leadership, & Mentorship

#### **Summary**

NWFSC's new "Entrepreneurship, Leadership, & Mentorship" (ELM) youth initiative is an 8-month extracurricular program that will run from October 2024-May 2025 for high school juniors and seniors who are interested in developing an entrepreneurial mindset, leadership skills, and developing as young professionals. Students who are invested in personal growth will learn about business, their local communities, and how their gifts and talents can be maximized in a future career. With a strong presence of and exposure to experts in their fields, students will have the opportunity to become mentees of community leaders while growing their network and learning with one another.

#### Mission

To create opportunities for secondary education students to expand their option for vocational paths, develop an entrepreneurial mindset, advance leadership and service skills, cultivate a lifelong dedication to community involvement, and equip youth with the tools to create successful futures for themselves, their local areas, and beyond.

#### Goals for the Participant

- To encourage students to recognize their own potential and strive for personal growth and professional development.
- To activate the entrepreneurial mindset and build start-up skills to ensure their success and to support a more vibrant community.
- To inspire students to cultivate leadership skills and an entrepreneurial mindset to carry throughout their lives.
- To provide an avenue for a diverse group of students to interact with one another, and with community leaders and decision makers.
- To give students hands-on experience in knowledge areas relevant to their career goals.
- To offer mentorship opportunities for students to learn from community leaders and skill experts.
- To acquaint students with local needs, resources, and other factors that influence the future development of Okaloosa and Walton counties.
- To foster students' interest in volunteer community involvement and practice service leadership.
- To equip students with the knowledge and tools to be active, effective members of society.
- To instill student pride in themselves, their communities, and their ability to give back to those communities.

#### **Application Criteria**

Applications for the '24-'25 inaugural class are due by September 15th, 2024. The program will accept anywhere from 15-20 student participants. The ideal candidates for ELM are students who:

- Demonstrate leadership qualities in their school and community
- Can commit necessary time and effort to complete the ELM program
- Hold high standards of personal integrity
- Desire to work with others in the community
- Possess and can maintain at least a 2.0 GPA or higher

#### **Graduation Requirements**

Participants must attend a **minimum** of 6 training sessions and take part in the execution and presentation of the class project to be eligible for program completion. Make-up options may be made available at the discretion of program leaders, as needed.
