



## Associate in Science in Nursing Program and Student Outcomes

### Program Outcomes:

**Pass rates on the NCLEX-RN for Northwest Florida State College nursing graduates will be at least 80% for all first-time test-takers during the same 12-month period.**

**At least 80% of students admitted to the Associate Degree Nursing program will complete the program of study within 100% (4 semesters) of the program length (as measured by the time the student begins the first nursing course).**
