NICEVILLE COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Extended Care AM

Parents may drop students off beginning 7:30 a.m. for supervised time before classes start. **There is no morning extended care on Mondays.**

Lunch

For full-day students only. Students may bring sack lunches or register for the lunch plan. Registering for this plan will provide students with a daily boxed lunch from our culinary staff. **If your child has special dietary restrictions and/or food allergies, please plan to provide their lunch each day.**

Extended Care PM

After the last class of the day, students will meet in “The Hangar” for supervised activities. Students enrolled in extended care PM must be picked up no later than 5:00 p.m. **There is no afternoon extended care on Fridays.**

ACADEMICS

American Sign Language *(Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)*

Welcome to the visual world! Come along as we explore Deaf Culture through the heart language of the Deaf - American Sign Language (ASL). Our class is designed to expose students to the depth and beauty of ASL while instilling a love for communication and human connection. Students will learn ASL fundamentals such as ABCs, numbers, basic phrases, and their names through an immersive language approach. *(The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

Create Your Own Superhero! *(Grades 3-7. Available Week 2 only, all sessions.)*

Students will create a new superhero, complete with superpowers, challenges, and a cool costume. The students will write a story starring their superhero and make a graphic novel (like the Dogman or Captain Underpants books) to tell the story!

Enviro Rangers: Into The Wild *(Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)*

Discover our amazing Florida environment: beaches, springs, swamps, forests, estuaries, aquifers, and our amazing native species! Learn what has the greatest impact on our Florida ecosystems by splashing around stormwater (interact with a hands-on demonstration!), getting messy with pollution (don't worry we will turn it into something new!), and identifying invasive species! Students will learn to appreciate the connection between the outdoors and personal well-being through engaging and inspiring interactive lessons. Let's help the next generation learn that natural Florida is special and worth every effort to protect! *(This class will go outside for some activities, weather permitting, but will not leave campus. The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*



Freshwater Frenzy (Grades 3-7. Available Week 1 only, all sessions.)

Join the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance as we take a dive into our local waters! If you like learning about frogs, bogs, water, and macroinvertebrates– this is the class for you! Together, we will be learning about all the life that can be found in and around freshwater. We will learn about frogs and toads, search for aquatic macroinvertebrates in leaf packs, dissect carnivorous plants, and learn about our watershed. Join us to explore the awesome waters of Florida!

Japanese Conversation (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

Do you like Japanese Anime or Manga? Do you want to learn the Japanese language to communicate with Japanese people? If you do, this class is for you! Learn Japanese greetings, basic conversation skills, useful phrases, expressions, and more. Learn to write your name in Japanese letters! *(The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

NEW! Leadership Quest (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

This brand-new leadership program teaches essential skills through fun, interactive activities. Campers will practice basic etiquette, making introductions, eye contact, active listening, respectful communication, and positive body language while engaging in hands-on team-building challenges. From group problem-solving missions to etiquette mini-lessons and leadership games, campers learn how to collaborate, take initiative, and support others. By the end of camp, each child leaves with stronger confidence and real-world leadership tools they can use at school and beyond. *(The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

Police Academy (Grades 6-7. Available both weeks, mornings only. *Combines 2 sessions, 9 AM-12 PM.*)

Police Camp is a week of activities and exercises that aim to enhance students' knowledge in law enforcement and public safety. Students will learn about defensive tactics, crime scene investigation, police K9s, firearms safety, and much more. *(The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

Scrubs for Kids (Grades 6-7. Available both weeks, mornings only.)

This super hands-on adventure is packed with games and activities – perfect if you love helping friends and want to explore amazing jobs in healthcare! Ever wonder what it's like to be a nurse - a real-life superhero for people who are sick or hurt? A physical therapy assistant who helps people get strong and move again with fun exercises? A radiography technician who takes special pictures inside the body like X-rays to spot problems? A medical laboratory technician who tests blood and samples in a lab to find clues about what's making someone sick? Then jump into Scrubs for Kids – it's made just for you! *(The instructional content of this course is the same for all weeks of camp.)*



NEW! Young Chefs Nutrition Lab (Grades 3-7. Available Week 1 only, all sessions.)

This interactive course introduces students to basic cooking skills through daily hands-on meal preparation, including breakfast, snacks, lunch, dinner, and dessert. Through fun cooking projects, food experiments, and interactive games, students will learn how to build nutritious meals to have at home or pack for school. Along the way, they'll discover how different ingredients help their brains think, their muscles move, and their bodies' defenses stay strong. This course will encourage curiosity, independence, and confidence in the kitchen.

ARTS

3D Printing (Grades 6-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

What the mind can imagine, a 3D printer can make! Digital creations come to life as the layers are put down. Visualize and create using "Tinkercad" 3D modeling software. Bring your designs to life with a 3D printer! (The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)

Advanced Drawing Techniques (Grades 6-7. Available both weeks, afternoons only.)

Building upon foundational drawing skills, this advanced course challenges young artists grades 6-7 to explore more complex techniques and detailed compositions. Participants will delve into various drawing methods, including intricate still life studies and sophisticated sketching with an introduction to graphic design elements. Students will refine their observational skills and artistic expression, creating more refined and nuanced artwork. (The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)

Beginning Drawing Techniques (Grades 3-5. Available both weeks, mornings only.)

Designed with beginners in mind, this drawing course is suitable for grades 3-5. The beginning steps start with shapes and lines that will then turn into a recognizable outcome. Young artists may then apply the knowledge they gain through each lesson to create unique masterpieces of their own. (The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)

NEW! Ceramics: Clay is the Way (Grades 3-7. Available Week 2 only, all sessions.)

Ready to get a little messy and get your hands dirty? Then sign-up for our new art class that takes clay and combines it with exciting hand-building techniques and sculptural themes. Students will learn fun ways to build figures, animals, small portrait busts, science fiction, fantasy creatures, objects, bowls, mugs, and more. Students will also learn how to glaze their art work using colored slips and underglazes!

Cookie Decorating (Grades 3-7. Available Week 1 only, all sessions.)

Decorating cookies is all about having the right tools and great tutorials. This class is fun-filled, hands-on, and guaranteed to sprinkle some cuteness into the summer days. Students will bring home all their goodies to share with family and friends. Make life sweeter, one cookie at a time! YUM! **Please note:** Participants in this course may be exposed to a variety of foods and ingredients, including but not limited to: nuts, peanuts, tree nuts, dairy, eggs, wheat, soy, gluten, food colorings, and other common allergens.



Color Your World, Artists! (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

Students will create artwork inspired by the world around us! Lessons will focus on color and how an artist can use their understanding of color to make engaging artwork. Students will learn to use color to communicate about our world, including their own thoughts and feelings. Students will experience a variety of artistic mediums including paint, pastels, collage, and more. *(The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

Cupcake Decorating (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

Become a cupcake superstar by learning basic cupcake decorating techniques! You will learn piping techniques, how to make colored icing, and how to use buttercream icing and fondant for decorations. You will also learn how to make cupcake holders to store and take home your creations, spreading cupcake joy to friends and family!

Please note: *Participants in this course may be exposed to a variety of foods and ingredients, including but not limited to: nuts, peanuts, tree nuts, dairy, eggs, wheat, soy, gluten, food colorings, and other common allergens. (The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.) *Due to the popularity of this course, participation is limited to one week per camper.*

Drama Kids (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

Immerse yourself in this fun, unpredictable, and high-energy workshop. This class is designed to expose students to memorable experiences in theater arts through scripted scenes, improvisation, musical theater, and theater games. *(The instructional content of this course is different for each week of camp.)*

Gifts from the Gulf (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

This class will transform any beach lover into a marine artist. Ocean artisans will create various 2D and 3D projects using multiple art mediums including watercolors, chalk, paper, and acrylics on paper and canvas. The sun, sand, saltwater, shells and sea life of our local waters will inspire these unique creations. Please feel free to bring your own special small seashells to add to your art. Please put shells in a zip lock bag labeled with your name. *(The instructional content of this course is different for each week of camp.)*

NEW! iPhoto, uPhoto, We All Photo (Grades 6-7. Available both weeks, all sessions)

Strike a pose and snap into action! In this fun, fast-paced photography camp, budding photographers will explore the world through the lens of their **own iPhone**. Each day brings a new challenge as campers learn how to capture stunning portraits, dramatic landscapes, exciting action shots, and amazing close-ups. From framing the perfect moment to experimenting with angles and lighting, you'll discover how to turn everyday scenes into eye-catching works of art. Campers will dive into smartphone photo-editing tools to enhance their images, add effects, play with color, and create polished, professional-looking photos. By the end of the week, you'll have the beginnings of your very own digital photo portfolio right on your camera roll—perfect for sharing with family, friends, or even future art classes. **Important: Students must have their own iPhone with photo-taking and editing capabilities and bring it each day.** *(The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

NEW! Pebble Pals (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions)

Get ready to bring ordinary rocks to life! In this creative, hands-on camp, you'll design your very own *Pebble Pal* using paint, markers, googly eyes, paper accessories, and tons of imagination. Once your new rocky friend is complete, you'll build a cozy custom enclosure—part habitat, part artwork! Then, take your creativity even further with a storytelling twist — Campers will write a mini story or character profile about their Pebble Pal—Who are they? What adventures have they been on? What secrets does their habitat hold? Your writing will bring your creation to life and make your project truly one of a kind. **Important: Please bring an empty tissue box or shoe box to transform into your Pebble Pal's one-of-a-kind home.** *(The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

Printmaking (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

If you've ever used a stamp, then you have practiced the art of printmaking! In this class, students will learn how to create their own art using printmaking techniques. Gelli plates will transfer textures and indentations to your paper and anothypes will use the sun and leaves to print shapes! Join us for a class of playing with textures, shapes and pressures! *(The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

ATHLETICS

Hip Hop Hooray (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, 9:00 AM, 10:30 AM, and 12:30 PM only.)

No dance experience needed. Learn basic routines that will jump-start learning how to move and groove. Join this class to learn the latest hip-hop dance. Make sure to wear comfortable clothes, socks and shoes. Let's get moving! *(Please bring a bottle of water each day. The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

Martial Arts Mania (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

Be more confident with self-defense strategies. Learn how to build self-esteem! Develop focus and power through board breaking! Gain speed and coordination with nun chucks! Come train and have fun in Martial Arts Mania! We teach the life skills you want for your children. Respect, confidence, self-control, discipline and to have a "YES I CAN" attitude! *(Please bring a bottle of water each day. The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*

Kids Yoga (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, all sessions.)

Come learn the basics of yoga through movement, breath work, games and meditation activities. Rookie Rugby (Grades 3-7. Available both weeks, mornings only. 9:00 AM is 6-7th grade; 10:30 AM is for 3-5th grade.) Designed with the American athlete in mind, Rookie Rugby is a fun, safe, team game that develops a range of ball handling, running and evasion skills. Participants learn the importance of teamwork and respect for opponents, coaches, and referees, which are key elements of all athletic endeavors. Students should wear sneakers and athletic clothing! Rookie Rugby will be a non-contact class taught outside. *(Please wear sunscreen and bring a bottle of water each day. The instructional content of this course is the same for both weeks of camp.)*
